# Minutes February 24, 2020

Tiffany Copple shared highlights of this year's achievements with the robotics program. There were 12 district teams consisting of approximately 48 students and 6 coaches in grades 3-8 who participated in the program. Grades 9-12 started robotics this year but do not compete in Vex Robotics. There are about 20 high school robotics students working with the drama club on a project for their upcoming play that involves a boat with some moving components. Mrs. Copple added that there will be a Summer Robotics Camp with about 100 students for the first time this

year. Scott 2 has hosted four Vex Robotics Tournaments providing numerous volunteers this year and three Scott 2 teams qualified to go to State on March 7 at Lucas Oil Stadium. Upcoming plans include a bowling bash for the students involved in robotics on March 11 to wrap up the season

Mrs. Craig made a motion to approve the second reading of the policies listed. Mrs. Soloe seconded and motion carried 5-0.

- VIII. Permission to Accept and Award Quotes
  - 1. Demolition of Houses on Vienna Property

Mrs. Roberts made a motion to accept quotes. Mrs. Craig seconded and motion to accept carried 5-0. Mr. Moore made a motion to award the low quote from Coomes Excavating for \$4,500 (not including rental of dumpsters) to demolish the three houses and garage on the Vienna Properties that were recently purchased. Mrs. Roberts seconded and motion carried 5-0.

- 2. McClain Hall Bleacher Replacement
  - A. Lee Company, Inc. (\$102,857.14 Wall Attached & \$137,551.02 Portable Total \$240,408.16)
  - B. Educational Furniture Portable Bleachers \$60,859
  - C. <u>Educational Furniture Wall Attached Bleachers</u> \$64,265

Dr. Slaton noted that \$30,000 from high school operation funds and \$30,000 from athletic operation funds will be used towards bleacher replacement. He added that if the Board approved allocating approximately \$68,000 in additional funds, the entire McClain Hall bleacher replacement project could be completed all at once, beginning right after graduation. Mrs. Corum felt the additional dollars would be available from the Operations Budget since Mr. Riley felt the remaining 2020 budget was enough to cover what he would need for buses. Mr. Moore made a motion to approve both Educational Furniture quotes for a total of \$125,124 (with \$60,000 coming from SHS and Athletics) to complete the entire bleacher replacement project in McClain Hall. Mrs. Craig seconded and motion carried 5-0.

- IX. Consider Approval of Early Childhood Education Vouchers
  - Mr. Brewster recommended approval of early childhood education vouchers from Family and Social Services Administration, Childcare Development Fund, and/or any other state or federal agencies from which early childhood education or PreK funding may become available. He stated that although this may not happen this school year, approval would be needed to accept vouchers at some point. There was discussion as to how the process would work and Mr. Brewster explained that there were stipulations as to who was able to sign up for vouchers and that there would need to be some type of scholarship available to those who do not qualify for vouchers. Mrs. Craig made a motion to approve accepting voucher monies. Mrs. Soloe seconded and motion carried 4-1. (Mr. Moore stated that he did not feel he could vote for this until he had more information.)
- Permission to Donate Surplus Buses
  Mr. Riley asked permission to donate four buses to the Fair Board for the bus derby. These buses were approved as surplus by the Board in December 2019 because they don't meet the criteria to be used to transport students. All

SCSD2 signage will be removed from the buses before they are donated. Mrs. Roberts made a motion to approve the donation. Mrs. Craig seconded and motion carried 5-0.

### Permission to Approve Stipend to Train New Bus Drivers - added 2-24-20

Mr. Riley asked permission to add a one dollar per hour stipend to Mrs. Glenna Hardin's pay for her to train new bus drivers. Mrs. Roberts made a motion to approve, seconded by Mrs. Craig. Motion carried 5-0.

Mrs. Roberts made a motion to adjourn at 7:28 pm. Mrs. Craig seconded and motion carried 5-0.
