d. Scottsburg High School Design Build Project Update- Schmidt Associates & Core Construction

Mr. Routt introduced the members from Core Construction & Schmidt Associates.

The group stated that they had been working with teachers and Administrators listening to what their needs would be when designing new classrooms. A slide show presentation was shared showing various options that had been created. At this time, these are still ideas with more talks in the near future with teachers and Administrators to finalize the plans. The board was very pleased with the overall design/ideas that they had created up to this point. The goal for the project to be completed is Fall 2023.

e.Enrollment Update

Enrollment data conflicts will be resolved and all schools' certified enrollment will be used for state funding calculations for the first half of 2022. The impact to our revenue from the state <u>per student</u> increase or decrease equals approximately \$7,000 per year, or \$3,500 per 6 months. As of February 1st, the official ADM Count Day, the district was down 18 students.

VII. Other Business

A. <u>Board Resolution Opposing HB 1134</u>

The board was all in agreement that House Bill 1134 is not a good direction for education to go and encouraged the public to read the House Bill and reach out and voice their non-support to their Senator. Mrs. Broady made a motion to approve the Resolution, second by Mrs. Soloe. Motion carried 5-0.

B. Quick Update on SES HVAC Project

Currently lots of items are on backorder as with everywhere. Also the cost is running approximately 20-25% more than pre-COVID prices. This project has been broken down into 3 phases. South side, north side, and water leakage issue on top floor. The water issue has been ongoing with our maintenance fixing different areas over the years. Dr. Slaton would like to address as much of the HVAC as possible but has reached out to others for pricing and trying to be creative regarding the reoccurring leaks and hopes to get it all fixed.

C. COVID Update

The numbers of students out for testing positive or needing to be quarantined have improved. 28 students out district wide Monday and 30 today. Not all attendance is up-to-date with the e-learning days we had due to ice and snow.

On Tuesday, February 1st, 2022, Governor Holcomb extended the Executive Order with the Public Health Emergency another 30 days. Thus the new executive order is good through March 4th, 2022. Governor Holcomb also extended the previous directives concerning COVID-19 control measures for K-12 Institutions. So at this point, the recommendation is to continue with masks as to minimize the number of students that must be guarantined because of these state directives.

Dr. Slaton made a recommendation to continue the mask mandate through March 8th.

Mrs. Soloe made a motion to approve the recommendation, second by Mr. Zollman. Motion carried 5-0.
